## The Body Is Dead But the Spirit Is Life

(Rom 8:10-11)

- Remember that chapter 8 is about the assurance of salvation "in Christ" (8:1)
- I. Paul has been contrasting the believer and the unbeliever in this sub-section
  - A) He has shown the effect the Spirit has on the Christian as compared to the mindset of the natural (lost) man
    - 1. Paul will now carry this comparison to the individual Christian
    - 2. He shows what is true of the body of the Christian and what is true of the spirit also:
      - i. Body is dead but the spirit is alive
      - ii. This is true of every Christian

## II. Terms

- A) "And, but"
  - 1. V.10 & 11 both contain a Greek word that is left untranslated 4 xs here in KJV
    - i. Ei- A conditional subjunctive- "Since, if, for as much as"
      - a) Literally- "On the one hand the body is dead on account of sin, but on the other hand the spirit is life on account of righteousness"
      - b) This rendering is further confirmation of our exposition of the section running from 5:1 though ch 8 ("In Adam" -vs- "in Christ")
  - 2. Compare the contrasted "but" in v.10 with v.9b
- B) "Body"
  - 1. Body here does not mean "flesh" of 8:5-8 (natural fallen nature)
  - 2. It is instead the physical body, the "mortal body" of ch 6-7
    - i. This includes all the faculties: actions, thoughts, emotions, etc.
- C) "Body is dead"
  - 1. This is not a command to "crucify the flesh" as some teach
  - 2. This is a flat statement of fact: the body is in a state of death
    - i. Rom 6:11-12- Same idea
    - ii. Adam's sin has brought the seed of death into the human race
      - a) This is true physically, but also spiritually and morally
      - b) This is the same teaching of Rom 5:12-21
      - c) Sin works in our mortal body/uses our mortal body against us
      - d) The "body" is our greatest enemy (as in ch 7)
        - 1) 1 Cor ch 15- "Sown in corruption" and "this corruptible"
- D) "Spirit"
  - 1. The translators of the KJV have capitalized this
  - 2. But this is not the "Holy Spirit", for that breaks the contrast Paul is making

- i. The physical part of the individual is being contrasted with the spiritual part (as in the whole section with Adam -vs- Christ)
- ii. Thus the "on the one hand, but on the other...."

## E) "Spirit is life"

- 1. Doesn't say "will be" (although he goes on to say the body "will be")
- 2. Spirit is alive now because of the seed of righteousness sown in it
  - i. 1 Pet 1:23- "Born of incorruptible seed"
  - ii. 1 John 3:9- "Seed remaineth in him"
  - iii. 2 Pet 1:4- "Partaker of the divine nature"
    - a) Great book by Henry Scougal- "The Life of God in the Soul of Man"
- 3. But the spirit wasn't always alive, it had to be regenerated
  - i. Eph 2:1-4- Dead in sin then quickened
  - ii. Rom 6:2-13- Dead to sin, alive unto God (in the spirit)
  - iii. John 5:21-24- "Passed from death unto life"
  - iv. Rev 20:1-6- "The 1st resurrection"
  - v. Col 3:1-4- 'Risen with Christ"
    - a) "Shall also quicken your mortal body"
      - 1) This is the point Paul is making in Rom 8:10-11:
        - (a) As Christ was quickened physically, so will we be

## F) "Because of"

- 1. On account of, due to
- G) "Righteousness"
  - 1. This is not referring to the level of my righteous walk
  - 2. This is the righteousness of Christ
    - i. Imputed righteousness (justification) and then imparted (sanctification's process) and finally physical righteousness (glorification)
      - a) Compare with the entry of sin by Adam:
        - 1) Sin entered an Adam died immediately spiritually
        - 2) Sin continued to work death in Adam/man's soul & body
        - 3) Sin finally brought about the death of Adam's body
- ii. Rom 5:17-21- Christ's righteousness is the grounds of our bodily resurrection III.Doctrine
  - A) 1 John 3:8- Christ came to destroy the works of the devil
    - 1. As the death that comes by sin is complete, so must redemption be complete
    - 2. Rom 8:22-23- Paul's explanation of v.11
      - i. The body of the believer "is dead", but it won't always be
      - ii. 2 Cor 4:7-18- Commentary of this teaching
        - a) "Inward man" = spiritual portion of saved man
        - b) 2 Cor 5:1-7- As our spirit is housed in the "dead body" currently, there will be a new abode for it soon
