The Glory Which Shall Be Revealed

(Rom 8:18)

- Remember the context is the assurance of justification by faith
- I. "Reckon"
 - A) *Logizomai* To reason, to account, to arrive at a conclusion, to logically conclude
 - 1. This is the same word elsewhere translated as "impute"
 - 2. This is not referring to "positive thinking" or "stoicism", neither is it persuading oneself, or "putting mind over matter"
 - 3. This is to think logically upon all the facts presented, and to arrive at a conclusion
 - i. It is a mode of thinking, or a "worldview"
 - a) Worldview- "A worldview is the set of beliefs about fundamental aspects of Reality that ground and influence all one's perceiving, thinking, knowing, and doing."
 - B) The Christian "reckoning" is based fundamentally upon a comparison:
 - 1. "This present time"
 - i. Time here means "age" or "world"
 - ii. It is not referring to time as a portion of this age, as in "well today is bad, but tomorrow will be better"
 - iii. This is the basis for a correct Christian worldview
 - a) 1 John 2:15-17- This world passes away
 - b) James 4:14- This life temporary
 - c) Job 14:1-2- Man's days are short and full of trouble
 - iv. But even the lost know that life is short and even troublesome
 - a) Eph 2:12- "Having no hope without Christ"
 - b) 1 Cor 15:32- "Eat and drink for tomorrow we die"
 - 1) This is the basic worldview of lost man today
 - 2. "The glory which shall be revealed"
 - i. Gen 3:15- Ever since the fall of man, the children of God have looked for the age to come
 - a) The Jews lived in expectation of the Messianic Age ("last days") in which would come redemption
 - 1) Christians are to also live in expectation of the age to come, what Paul here calls the "redemption of the body" and all creation
 - 2) Every New Testament writer speaks of this:
 - 1. John 14:1- "Behold, I go to prepare for you a place..."

- 2. Acts 1:11- "This same Jesus shall come again...."
- 3. Acts 3:19-21- "The restitution of all things..."
- 4. Eph 1:14 & 4:30- "Sealed unto the day of redemption"
- 5. Col 3:4- "When Christ shall appear..."
- 6. 2 Tim 4:1- 'At His appearing and kingdom...."
- 7. Tit 2:11-13- "Blessed hope and glorious appearing..."
- 8. Heb 9:28- "He shall appear the 2nd time..."
- 9. 1 Pet 1:3-13- Peter goes into much detail
- 10.1 John 3:1-2- "When He shall appear"

ii. "In us"

- a) In other words "in store for us"
- b) It is this that makes it our blessed hope, we won't simply be able to see it, we shall be part of it!
 - 1) Rom 8:17- Joint-heirs with Christ
 - 2) This is the thought running through all the passages about the glory to come
 - 1. Rom 8:29-30- Glorification is at the 2nd coming, not at our physical death
 - (a) Rev 6:9-11- The saints in heaven awaiting the "glorification"
 - (b) 1 John 3:1-2- We don't yet see it clearly, but do have the revelation of in in the scriptures ("walk by faith")
 - (c) Thus the worldview the Christian has today is one based upon the truth revealed in the scriptures concerning both this present world and the world to come
 - (1)2 Cor 11:14- Satan transformed as angel of light, and thus also is his "world" camouflaged in subtlety
 - (2) Rom 12:1-3 & Tit 2:11-13- Living "soberly"
- c) Rom 8:19-24- Paul teaches that this full revelation/manifestation shall be at the restoration of all creation
 - 1) This "glory" is not to be "created" but "revealed" (already exists)
 - 1. Matt 25:34- "Kingdom prepared for you from foundation..."
 - (a) It was there for Adam, and seems to have been able to be gained through obedience (tree of life)
 - (b) 2 Cor 12:1-4- Paul had a glimpse of it
 - (1) It was this glimpse that must have helped him speak as he did in 2 Cor 4:17
 - (2) 1 Cor 16:22- Maranatha- "Come Lord"
